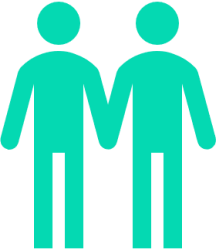

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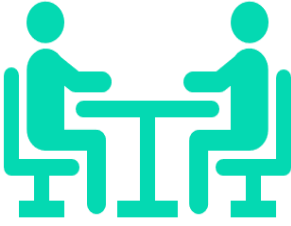
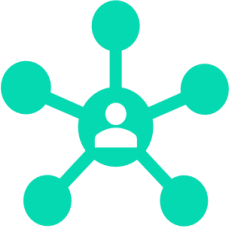
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## Section 1 Policy and Rights

<h2>Your Rights</h2>	
	<p>This document tells you about <b>your rights</b>.</p>
	<p><b>Australian laws</b> respect the rights of people with disability. The laws say you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● should be <b>included in community life</b>, and</li> <li>● have the <b>same rights</b> as all other Australians.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>What are your human rights?</b></p>
	<p>You should be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● <b>safe</b> in your home and anywhere else</li> <li>● treated with <b>respect</b></li> <li>● part of your cultural <b>community</b>.</li> </ul>

	<p>You should be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● <b>participate</b> in your <b>religion</b></li> <li>● express your <b>sexuality</b></li> <li>● communicate in your family's <b>language</b>.</li> </ul>
	<p>You also have rights when working with Capable Juniors Academy Ltd and other disability support providers.</p>
	<p>You have the right to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● receive good quality services</li> <li>● tell us what you want</li> <li>● choose the type of support worker you want</li> <li>● make your own choices.</li> </ul>
	<p>You also have the right to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● be safe</li> <li>● get help when you need it</li> <li>● try new things and take risks.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>How does Capable Juniors Academy Ltd respect your rights?</b></p>


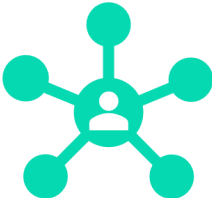



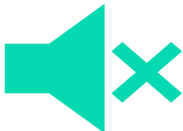
	<p>Capable Juniors Academy Ltd will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● keep you <b>safe</b></li><li>● show you <b>respect and respect your privacy</b></li><li>● <b>treat you well</b></li><li>● <b>help you</b> make your own choices</li><li>● <b>listen to you</b></li><li>● <b>involve your family, advocate and other support carers</b> (if you want us to).</li></ul>
	<p>We will also:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● ask you to tell us <b>what supports you want and the type of worker you need</b></li><li>● keep your <b>personal information private.</b></li></ul>
	<p>We can also help you find an advocate if you need one.</p>

	<p>You can safely:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● <b>make complaints</b> and provide feedback to us</li><li>● tell us if you want to use another provider.</li></ul>
	<p>We will <b>follow your instructions</b> unless we feel that you may get hurt.</p> <p>We will then talk to you and your advocate/family about any risks to help you make a safe decision.</p>
	<p>We also make sure our support workers follow our Service <b>Code of Conduct</b>.</p>

<h2>Advocacy</h2>	
	This document will help you understand <b>advocacy and who an advocate is.</b>
	Advocacy is when a person publicly helps to <b>promote, provide and protect your human rights</b>
	Advocacy can help <b>your voice be heard and your wishes met.</b> Advocacy can <b>be used to help you become part of your community</b>
	Sometimes you might find it <b>hard to say what you want.</b> You might want someone to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● <b>support</b> you</li> <li>● <b>speak up</b> for you</li> <li>● be your <b>voice.</b></li> </ul>
	An advocate can be that person. An advocate is someone who provides a public voice for you if you cannot or do not want to speak up for yourself.

## Advocacy

	<p>This document will help you understand <b>advocacy and who an advocate is.</b></p>
	<p>An advocate should be fair and treat everybody in the same way.</p>
	<p>You can ask someone <b>you trust</b> to be your advocate, like your:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● mum or dad</li> <li>● brother or sister</li> <li>● close friend.</li> </ul>
	<p>Or you can ask a <b>professional, independent advocate</b> to help you and be your voice.</p> <p>They can help you make good decisions and choices right for you.</p>
	<p>Your advocate should always:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● <b>listen and support</b> you</li> <li>● <b>take your side</b></li> <li>● <b>help you make your own good choices and decisions</b></li> </ul>

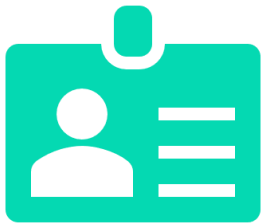
<h2>Advocacy</h2>	
	This document will help you understand <b>advocacy and who an advocate is.</b>
	Your advocate can <b>help you:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● get ready for <b>meetings</b></li> <li>● tell people/providers <b>what you want</b></li> <li>● <b>by signing documents</b> for you.</li> </ul>
	Importantly, your advocate <b>can represent you and speak on your behalf.</b>
	Your advocate can help you <b>make a complaint</b> if you are not happy <b>with:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● supports provided</li> <li>● the way you have been treated.</li> </ul>
	Your advocate <b>can speak for you</b> and tell us how <b>you have been mistreated.</b> They will help us understand the <b>support and assistance you need.</b>
	Your advocate must keep your information <b>private.</b>

	This document will help you understand <b>advocacy and who an advocate is.</b>

## Privacy and Your Personal Information



This document tells you **about your privacy and your personal information.**



To help us provide you with the proper support and services, **we collect and store personal information** about you.









We use your personal information to work with you to **design supports and care that meets your needs.**

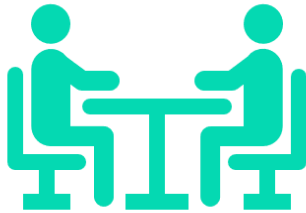


Personal information can include:

- your **name, address and phone number**
- **your advocate's** contact details
- details about **people who you are close to** (mum, brother or a good friend)
- **supports** you need

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• your <b>medical records</b></li> <li>• other <b>support providers</b> you use</li> <li>• <b>why and how</b> we are helping you.</li> </ul>
	<p>It is Capable Juniors Academy Ltd <b>responsibility to keep</b> your personal information <b>private and safe</b>.</p>
	<p>We <b>only share</b> your information with others if <b>you say "yes"</b> or if the law says we must.</p>
	<p>You can say 'no' when asked to share your information with government agencies (like the NDIS). This instruction means you <b>opt-out of sharing</b> your personal information.</p>
	<p>We will ask you to <b>sign an information consent form</b>. The form <b>gives us your approval</b> to use your personal information.</p>



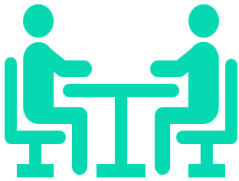
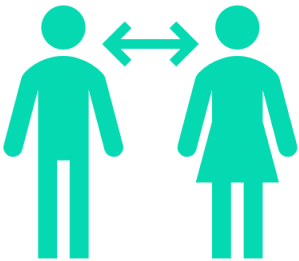

	<p>We also ask you to include all the people with whom you are happy to share your personal information on the form.</p>
	<p>Your information will <b>only be shared</b> with <b>people who you have said can see it</b>, like:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● an advocate</li><li>● a trusted person</li><li>● other support providers</li><li>● support workers</li><li>● government organisations that support you.</li></ul>
	<p><b>You have rights</b> when it comes to the management of your personal information.</p>







You can:






- **ask our Director to see** your personal information at anytime
- tell us **to correct** wrong or incomplete information
- **tell us if you think the** information is wrong and must be deleted
- **be part of our policy and practice** development by telling management how we work with you.




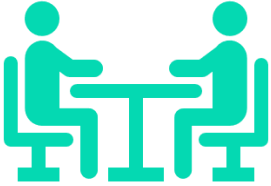

## Complaints and Feedback


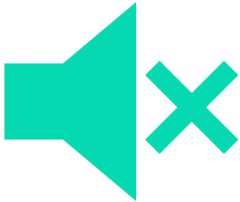


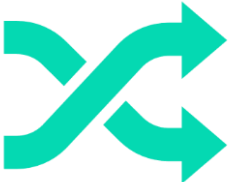
	<p>This document tells you <b>how to make a complaint or give feedback</b></p>
	<p><b>Director wants</b> you to give us <b>feedback or make a complaint</b> if you are unhappy.</p>
	<p>It is <b>okay to complain</b> if you are not happy. Tell us when you are upset about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● the <b>supports</b> you received</li> <li>● your <b>support workers</b></li> <li>● Capable Juniors Academy Ltd</li> </ul>
	<p>If you do not feel comfortable telling us about your complaint, <b>you should tell someone you trust</b> like your:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● mum or dad</li> <li>● brother or sister</li> <li>● support worker.</li> </ul> <p><b>Ask them to help you make a complaint.</b></p>
	<p>Or you can get help from a <b>professional, independent advocate</b> to make a complaint or provide feedback to us.</p>

	<p>We can <b>help you find</b> an advocate if you want.</p> <p>Ask our Director to help you. Call them on 0431 819 685</p>
	<p><b>How do you make a complaint or provide feedback to us??</b></p>
	<p>You can <b>talk</b> to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● your <b>support worker</b></li> <li>● our <b>Complaints Managers</b></li> <li>● the <b>Director</b></li> </ul>
	<p>You can <b>call or email our Complaints Manager</b> directly:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Call: 0431 819 685 or 0427 606 795</li> <li>● Email: <a href="mailto:chantelle@capablejuniors.com">chantelle@capablejuniors.com</a> or <a href="mailto:admin@capablejuniors.com">admin@capablejuniors.com</a></li> </ul>

	<p>You can fill out the <b>Complaints and Feedback Form</b> via the link in your service agreement. Ask the Complaints Manager or your therapist for a copy of link needed if you are unable to access it.</p>
	<p>You can fill in the <b>participant survey</b> we send to you every year.</p>
	<p>You can make a complaint <b>at any time</b> directly to the <b>NDIS Commission</b>:  Call: <b>1800 03 55 44</b>  Or go to their website:  <a href="http://www.ndiscommission.gov.au">www.ndiscommission.gov.au</a></p>
	<p>You can make a <b>complaint and remain anonymous</b>.  Anonymous means we will not know who you are.</p>
	<p>To be anonymous, use the <b>Anonymous Complaint and Feedback Form</b> provided to you in your service agreement after your intake meeting:  <b>Complete the form</b> (your advocate can do this for you).</p>

	<p><b>Remember</b>, if you complain anonymously, we <b>cannot provide you with a response</b>, as we will not know who you are</p>
	<p>We take <b>all complaints and feedback</b> we receive <b>seriously</b>. <b>They help us to improve our service and supports for you!</b></p>
	<p><b>How do we manage your complaint or feedback?</b></p>
	<p>Our <b>Complaints Manager</b> will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● <b>talk</b> with you about your problem</li> <li>● <b>listen</b> to your voice</li> <li>● <b>write</b> everything you say down</li> <li>● <b>plan</b> to fix your problem with your input.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>Complaints Manager</b> will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● try to <b>fix your problem</b></li> <li>● <b>contact you regularly</b> to tell you how the issue is being fixed.</li> </ul>

	<p>To keep you safe, if your complaint or feedback involves someone being put <b>in danger of being hurt</b>, we will tell the police and the NDIS.</p>
	<p>We <b>keep</b> everything you tell us <b>privately</b>.</p>
	<p>If <b>you are unhappy</b> with the way we handle your feedback or complaint, you can <b>tell the NDIS Commission</b>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Call: <b>1800 03 55 44</b> (free call from a landline)</li> <li>• Go to their website: <a href="http://www.ndiscommission.gov.au">www.ndiscommission.gov.au</a></li> </ul>
<h2>Conflict of Interest</h2>	
	<p>This document explains what a <b>conflict of interest is</b> and what Director does to manage them</p>
	<p>A conflict of interest is when a staff member's interests are different to Capable Juniors Academy Ltd's or your best interests</p>

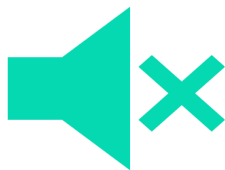
<b>Conflict of Interest</b>	
	Our staff should always do what is best for you and Capable Juniors Academy Ltd.
	Our staff's interests are called <b>private interests</b>
	A <b>private interest</b> can be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>direct</b> – something owned by the person</li> <li>• <b>indirect</b> – something owned by a family member or a close friend.</li> </ul>
	A <b>private interest</b> can also be: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>financial</b> – getting money from it</li> <li>• <b>non-financial</b> – builds personal relationships in the community or with friends and family.</li> </ul>
	It is <b>okay</b> for staff to have a conflict of interest, <b>as long as they tell</b> Capable Juniors Academy Ltd We can <b>then decide</b> what to <b>do</b> about their conflict of interest to <b>manage it</b> .

## Conflict of Interest

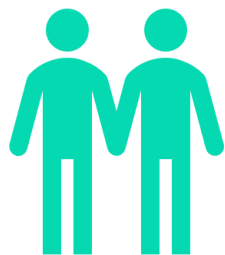


A conflict of interest may be:

- **actual** – it happened
- **potential** – it could become a problem
- **perceived** – it seems like a conflict but is okay as long as it is monitored.








A conflict of interest is **wrong** when a staff member uses it to **get more than they should** for themselves or their friends.









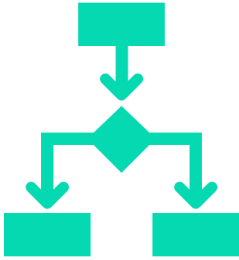

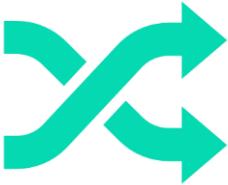

A conflict of interest can happen if a staff member's **close friends or family become involved in work decisions.**



A conflict of interest can happen if a **staff member gets extra money** by working for a **different company** at Capable Juniors Academy Ltd.

<b>Conflict of Interest</b>	
	<p>A conflict of interest happens when our <b>staff</b>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• are <b>involved with another organisation</b></li> <li>• <b>encourage you</b> to use the other Provider to receive support.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>How does</b> Capable Juniors Academy Ltd <b>manage a staff conflict of interest?</b></p>
	<p>We ask our <b>staff to tell us</b> (declare) their <b>conflict of interest as soon as possible</b>.</p>
	<p>Our Director <b>assesses all staff conflicts of interest</b> to ensure they will not severely impact our organisation or you.</p>
	<p>Our Director will <b>manage and monitor</b> all declared conflicts to ensure they continue not to impact you or us.</p>

<b>Conflict of Interest</b>	
	<p>We regularly check that conflicts of interest <b>are not impacting</b> Capable Juniors Academy Ltd 's:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• support provision</li> <li>• quality of support</li> <li>• good decision-making</li> </ul>
	<p><b>How do we ensure there is no conflict of interest with a participant?</b></p>
	<p>Our Director will discuss any identified conflicts of interest that could impact the support you receive.</p>
	<p>Our Director will explain how we <b>will manage the conflict</b></p>
	<p>We want you to <b>tell us</b> if you are <b>unhappy</b> about managing the conflict of interest.</p>






<b>Conflict of Interest</b>	
	We will <b>work with you</b> to try and <b>make changes</b> to make you happy.
	<b>Any decisions you make about your providers or supports will not impact the current supports we provide you.</b>
	<b>Using other providers will not impact the quality of support you receive from Capable Juniors Academy Ltd.</b>
	<b>If we cannot fix the conflict of interest and you are unhappy, we may refer you to another provider</b>
	We will <b>talk with you about this.</b>  We will find the <b>best way</b> to continue receiving the support you need.

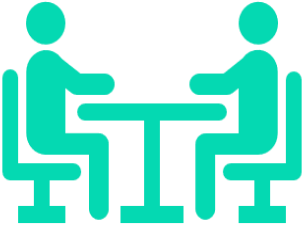

## Incident Management

	<p>This document tells you <b>what an incident is</b> and how Capable Juniors Academy Ltd <b>manages them</b>.</p>
	<p>There are <b>two types</b>:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. A general incident</li> <li>2. A reportable incident.</li> </ol>
	<p>A <b>general incident</b> is when:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a person <b>causes you harm</b> or could have caused you harm</li> <li>• <b>you hurt someone else</b></li> <li>• you feel that someone is <b>going to hurt you</b>.</li> </ul>
	<p>A <b>reportable incident</b> is when one of the following happens:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a death</li> <li>• a serious injury</li> <li>• harm</li> <li>• neglect</li> <li>• sexual misconduct</li> <li>• unregulated use of restrictive practices.</li> </ul>
	<p>If your worker believes you have been harmed or may be at risk of being harmed, they will call the Child Abuse Reporting Line to protect you.</p>

## Incident Management

	<p>If you are involved in an incident, you must <b>immediately tell our Director, your therapist or a trusted person.</b></p>
	<p>Our therapist or Director can <b>meet with you to record</b> what was said and done during the incident.</p>
	<p>Our director or therapist will ask you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>what happened</b></li> <li>• the names of <b>people who saw</b> the incident</li> <li>• <b>when you told someone</b> about the incident (date and time)</li> <li>• details of the <b>person you told</b></li> <li>• how the incident <b>affected you</b></li> <li>• what could be <b>done to stop the incident from happening again.</b></li> </ul>
	<p>Your <b>safety is important</b> to us. After an incident, <b>we will provide support or assistance</b> to help you recover from the incident.</p>

## Incident Management



**We will support you by:**

- **fixing** the incident quickly
- helping you look **after your health and wellbeing** (where we can).



We will regularly **keep you up to date** with **managing the incident**.



The Director or therapist will **contact you to:**

- **talk about what happened**
- **tell you** what **actions we** will take **to fix** the incident
- explain to you what **steps** have already been **taken**



We will ask for your:

- **feedback** and **thoughts** on how we are fixing the problem
- **ideas** about any changes that could **help you in the future**.



Our Director **investigates the incident** to work out what happened and stop it from happening again.

## Incident Management



We then **complete a review** of the incident to **improve our service by:**

- **learning** what happened
- **making changes** to stop it from happening again.



Some changes we might make could be to:

- change our practices
- change our policies
- retrain our staff.



### Reportable incidents



A **reportable incident** is when you or another participant are **badly hurt** or **mistreated**.






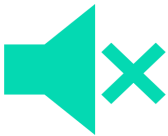

If a **reportable incident** happens, Capable Juniors Academy Ltd must **tell** the **NDIS Commission** and the Department of Child Protection.



We must **complete an NDIS Reportable Incident Form**.

	Capable Juniors Academy Ltd must send the form to the NDIS Commission using the <b>NDIS portal</b> .
	The <b>NDIS Commission reviews the incident</b> . They will tell us if we need to take <b>any further action</b> .
	We will <b>update you on the NDIS Commission's findings</b> , including any actions we must take
	We <b>keep everything you tell us privately</b> .
	If <b>you are unhappy</b> with the way we handle your incident, you can <b>tell the NDIS Commission</b> : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Call: <b>1800 03 55 44</b> (free call from a landline)</li> <li>• Go to their website: <a href="http://www.ndiscommission.gov.au">www.ndiscommission.gov.au</a></li> </ul>

## Zero Tolerance – Harm, Risk of Harm, Violence, Abuse, Neglect and Exploitation



This document tells you how Capable Juniors Academy Ltd **prevents or manages** harm, risk of harm, neglect and exploitation.



You have **the right** to enjoy a life **free from violence, harm, neglect and exploitation**.



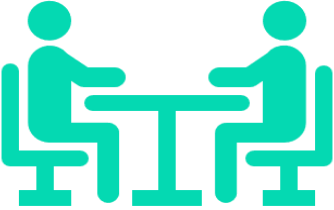



**You should always feel safe** when receiving support from us.



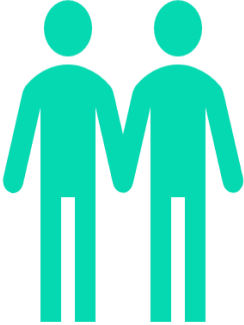

If you **do not feel safe**, tell your worker immediately.



**Violence** is when someone **hurts you physically** (like hitting, punching or slapping you).

	<p><b>Harm</b> is when someone <b>mistreats you</b> and might hurt your body or feelings.</p>
	<p><b>Neglect</b> is when someone is <b>not caring for you or helping you</b> how they are supposed to.</p>
	<p><b>Exploitation</b> is when someone is taking <b>advantage of you</b>.</p>
	<p>Capable Juniors Academy Ltd <b>does not allow</b> any acts of violence, harm, exploitation or neglect towards you.</p>
	<p>It is our <b>responsibility to protect you</b> and <b>keep you safe</b>.</p>

	<p>We want you <b>to tell us if someone hurts you</b> or if you <b>do not feel safe when with someone</b>.</p>
	<p>If you do not feel comfortable telling us, <b>you should tell someone you trust</b> like your:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● mum or dad</li><li>● brother or sister</li><li>● support worker.</li></ul>
	<p>Or you can get help from a <b>professional, independent advocate</b>.</p>
	<p>We can <b>help you find</b> an advocate if you want. Ask our Director for help. Call 0431 819 685.</p>

	<p>You can also get help by calling the <b>National Disability Abuse Hotline</b> on <b>1800 880 052</b>.</p>
	<p>To <b>keep you safe</b>, we will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• make sure our <b>staff follow the rules</b></li><li>• <b>train staff</b> on how to help you</li><li>• keep your <b>information private</b>.</li></ul>
	<p>Capable Juniors Academy Ltd will always:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>support you</b> if something terrible happens</li><li>• <b>call the police or Child Abuse Report Line (CARL)</b> if necessary.</li></ul>
	<p>We will always:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>listen to you</b> or your advocate</li><li>• provide you with the <b>support you need</b></li><li>• <b>keep you updated</b> on what is going on.</li></ul>

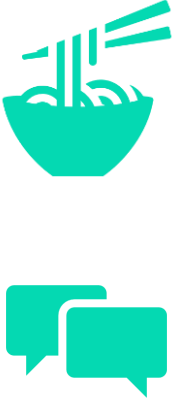

Planning with you	
	Your <b>voice</b> is essential for us to know how to work with you.
	Please tell us about your needs and requirements.
	Your Support Plan is designed with you at the centre of all actions.
	Our staff will look at your current NDIS Plan funding to ensure that we have the services you need.
	To create your plan, we may need to talk to your family, health providers and others (with your permission)
	We will consult with you about many supports such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Living skill development</li> <li>• Your interests, leisure and community group involvement</li> <li>• Travelling and transport needs</li> </ul>




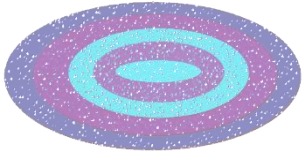



	<p>We will consult about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● family relationships</li> <li>● cultural requirements, e.g. food,</li> <li>● spiritual Identity – religious needs</li> <li>● communication methods</li> </ul>
	<p>Your safety is checked:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● physical environment</li> <li>● personal emergency plan tested</li> </ul>
	<p>Your health needs are assessed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● medical needs</li> <li>● general health requirements</li> <li>● high-intensity requirements</li> <li>● allied health services</li> <li>● comprehensive health</li> <li>● vaccination support</li> <li>● oral health</li> </ul>
	<p>We look for risks so we can get rid of or reduce them</p>








	We will <b>create</b> risk strategies with you and <b>train</b> our staff in these
	Your Support Plan is reviewed quarterly.
	If your needs change, then we will review your plan earlier
	You will need to <b>sign</b> your Support Plan
	We will provide you with a <b>copy</b> of the Support Plan

Risk Assessment	
	Your safety is essential to your support
	Assessing risks to you will occur regularly. Your risk assessment starts at your initial intake, then at least annually.
	When your situation changes, we will undertake another risk assessment.
	A risk is when it is probable that a specific event or activity may lead to you or someone else being hurt.
	We assess risks by asking: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● What could go wrong?</li> <li>● How often?</li> <li>● How bad?</li> <li>● Is there action needed?</li> </ul>
	A strategy will be written for any risk and recorded in your Support Plan.






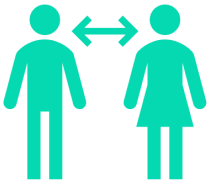
Risk Assessment	
	Your safety is essential to your support
	We will discuss your risks and their strategies with you.
	If we think an activity has high real or potential risk. We will talk to you about the risks. You can agree to undertake this activity (Informed-Consent)
	Your environment is checked for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Trips and falls</li> <li>● Electrical issues – cords</li> <li>● Hot water temperature</li> <li>● Medication storage</li> <li>● Pets</li> <li>● Physical environment – stairs etc</li> </ul>
	Your emotional environment is checked to ensure the people around

Risk Assessment	
	Your safety is essential to your support
	you are supportive and not hurting you.
	We look for risks so we can get rid of or reduce them
	We will create and train staff in your risk strategies
	If your needs change, then we will review your risks earlier







Safe Environment	
	Your safety is our priority.
	We will assess your environment to make sure you are safe.
	Our checks will look at your floors to help reduce your risks – trips and falls
	Our team may check your <b>flooring</b> – any rips, tears or lifting flooring or rugs.
	Our checks will look for any <b>electrical</b> problems such as cords hanging or frayed
	We will make sure your <b>hot water</b> is at the right temperature to prevent you from burns or scalds
	Your <b>medication storage</b> is checked.








Safe Environment	
	Your safety is our priority.
	If you have <b>pets</b> , a plan will be devised to prevent any incidents between the pet and our staff.
	Please do not smoke when our staff are present.
	Sometimes we may have to wear masks to stop you and us from getting sick.
	Our team will make sure that we clean to prevent germs from spreading.
	Our team may wear gloves so we don't make you sick
	Wash your hands regularly, especially after using the toilet or blowing your nose

## Safe Environment





	<p>Your safety is our priority.</p>
	<p>To keep you safe, our team will wash their hands, wear gloves and use hand sanitisers.</p>
	<p>If we clean your home, we will ensure we clean all surfaces and get rid of all rubbish as your plan says.</p>
	<p>If you are sick, please tell us, so we know how to manage your support.</p>
	<p>We will talk to you at least every year about your safety</p>
	<p>Talk to us any time if you are unsure or feel unsafe.</p>





## Emergency and Disaster Planning





	<p>We will work with you to create an emergency plan.</p>

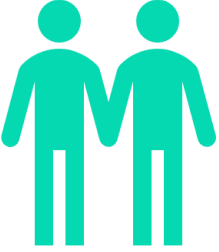
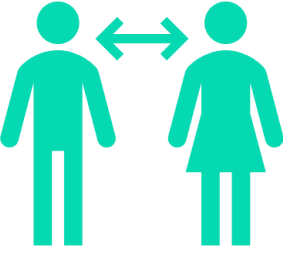
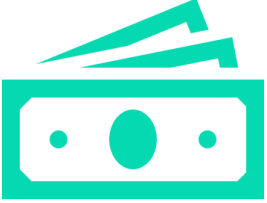
## Service Agreement






	<p>This document tells you a Service Agreement <b>and why you need one.</b></p>
	<p>A <b>Service Agreement</b> is a <b>document.</b></p> <p>It is an <b>agreement between you and your service provider.</b></p> <p>The <b>service provider</b> is the person or organisation that supports you (like Capable Juniors Academy Ltd)</p>
	<p>When you agree on the services you want from the Provider, it is <b>written down</b> in the Service Agreement.</p>
	<p>The Service Agreement says that you and your <b>Provider agree to the services they will provide.</b></p>

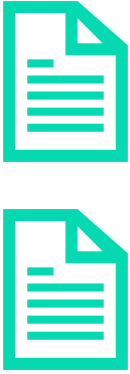




	<p>To <b>show that you agree, you sign</b> the Service Agreement.</p> <p><b>We (the Provider) will also sign</b> the agreement</p>
	<p>The Service Agreement helps make sure you receive the right services <b>for you.</b></p>
	<p>Your Service Agreement is helpful because it <b>provides everything agreed to in writing.</b></p>
	<p>If you need help entering a Service Agreement, you can <b>ask a trusted person to support you.</b></p> <p>A trusted person might be a <b>family member, carer, a friend or an independent advocate.</b></p>

	<p>Your trusted person (advocate) <b>can speak on your behalf.</b></p>
	<p>Your trusted person (advocate) can <b>sign your Service Agreement</b> for you (but only if you say that is okay).</p>
	<p><b>What information should be in a Service Agreement?</b></p>
	<p>We will meet with you and ask you to talk to us about the support you want.</p>








	<p>We want you to tell us:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● what type of <b>support do you need</b></li> <li>● how you <b>want your support</b> provided</li> <li>● the type of <b>support worker</b> you want to work with</li> <li>● <b>when you need</b> supports</li> <li>● <b>how long</b> you will need the support.</li> </ul>
	<p><b>We will talk to you</b> about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● the supports <b>we can provide</b></li> <li>● your rights and responsibilities</li> <li>● our <b>responsibilities</b></li> <li>● anything <b>special that we must consider</b>.</li> </ul>
	<p>It is a good idea to <b>bring a copy of your NDIS Plan</b> to your Service Agreement meetings. (If you want, we can put a copy of your plan in your agreement.)</p>

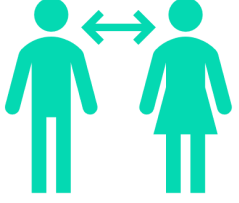


	<p>Once we both have <b>agreed on supports and costs</b>, we will write the Service Agreement.</p> <p>We will then provide two copies for you to read and sign.</p>
	<p>The Service Agreement will include what is expected from <b>you and us (our responsibilities)</b>.</p>
	<p>We will explain <b>our responsibilities</b> to you.</p> <p>We will <b>explain your responsibilities which you must meet</b>.</p>
	<p>The Service Agreement will include <b>information about costs</b>.</p> <p>It will include how much our service will cost you.</p>








	<p><b>When do you sign the Service Agreement?</b></p>
	<p>After you, or your trusted person, has read the Service Agreement.</p>
	<p>After you or your trusted person have had <b>your say</b> and are <b>happy that the Service Agreement meets your needs</b>.</p>
	<p>You only <b>sign the Service Agreement</b> if you <b>agree</b> with what is written in it.</p> <p>There will be <b>two copies to sign</b> (one for you and one for us).</p>
	<p><b>You sign the agreement, and then we will sign it.</b></p>

	<p>We will <b>give you a copy</b> of your Service Agreement, and we will keep a copy in your file.</p>
	<p>Do not forget to keep your <b>copy in a safe and private place.</b></p>
	<p>You can <b>change or end</b> your Service Agreement with us.</p> <p>Just talk to our Director to change an agreement.</p>

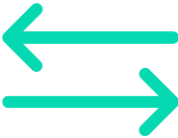
